Title: The Specifics of the Functional Approach in the Study of Russian Grammar

Abstract:

This paper examines the specifics of teaching grammar within Bard-Smolny Russian Language Immersion program at St. Petersburg State University, Russia.

The functional approach to the study of grammar is one of the most important and effective methods of selection and organization of educational material. In accordance with this approach, all basic grammatical structures are accompanied by tables and examples of typical and specific contexts, exceptions and stylistic variations. The choice of grammar models depends on the level of students' proficiency. Categories of time, space, subjectivity, objectivity, possessive and conditional constructions exist in all languages and may be studied comparatively. At the Beginner and Intermediate levels we introduce constructions such as place, space, time, purpose, cause, condition and comparison in simple sentences, verbs of motion with and without prefixes, etc. For Upper-Intermediate and Advanced levels we work with extended versions of basic constructions in simple and compound sentences with the addition of concessive, resultative and passive constructions, participles and verbal adverbs, verbs of motion of the ΓΗΑΤΒ-ΓΟΗЯΤЬ, БРЕСТИ-БРОДИТЬ type, etc.

Extensive experience of working with American students from different programs allowed us to choose relevant material for the English-speaking students and thus prove the effectiveness of the functional approach. In this paper, I will analyze and distinguish some traditionally difficult constructions with the prepositions 3A - ДЛЯ; time constructions with the prepositions 3A, 4A, 4A,
